

A Message from Father George Alexson

THE "KOIMISIS" (FALLING ASLEEP) OF THE THEOTOKOS



In the sacred books of our Orthodox Church, the Koimisis of the Theotokos, celebrated on the 15th of August, is announced with these words: "On August 15 we commemorate the august Translation of our most glorious Lady Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary." The Synaxarion describes the circumstances surrounding the "Metastasis" (translation) of the body of the Virgin Mary, since no mention is made of this event in the Holy Gospels.

According to tradition, when our Lord wanted His mother to join Him in His Father's Kingdom, He sent the Archangel Gabriel three days prior, to announce to Mary that she would be taken from this passing life to life eternal. When the Theotokos heard this announcement she rejoiced greatly and, as was her custom, went to pray on the Mount of Olives. Thus began her preparations for life eternal.

As we note in the icon of the Koimisis, the Theotokos is surrounded by the Apostles and other faithful, while her soul, in the form of an infant, is being taken above by Christ Himself. The Apostles buried her sacred body with pious devotion in the Garden of Gethsemane. The only Apostle not present for her burial was Thomas. When he arrived in Jerusalem three days later, saddened greatly by his absence, the others took him to Gethsemane, to reverence the body of the Theotokos. It was then that they were astonished to find her tomb empty, with only the grave clothes left behind, as happened in her Son's empty tomb. The Apostles knelt and prayed at the empty tomb of our Panagia with great reverence, acknowledging that she had been "translated" from the tomb and taken up into heaven.

This "utterly unknowable" mystery (as St. Dionysius the Pseudo-Areopagite puts it) of the alteration and incorruptibility of the Virgin's body, cannot be comprehended by us, the faithful, without the divine ray of mystical contemplation, which alone can make us capable of spiritual introspection. When thus enlightened, we are made to see not only the change and incorruptibility of the blessed Virgin's body, but that the bodies of all Christians, who aspire to live a holy life, will succeed in obtaining "theosis," which is the supreme vocation of every believer, the goal and end of every spiritually oriented human being.


For this reason, the Church sets aside the fourteen days of preparation for the celebration of the Koimisis, as days of strict fasting and prayer. With the skill of fasting, we are able to control not only what we eat but, more importantly, the passions that torment us and alienate us from purity and a life in Christ. As St. Nicodemus the Athonite reminds us, "let us create in our memory and in our heart a reservoir and dwelling place for the virtues practiced by the Theotokos. How can we achieve this? Is not the Theotokos a Virgin, a lover of virginity, purity, and chaste? Certainly! So too must we strive to imitate her in these virtues..." The art of fasting is a discipline that supports us in the restoration of our ability to exercise our free will in humble obedience to the commandments of God. Through fasting we are able to renew our baptismal purity essential for holiness, perfection, and our restoration and translation from this life to the Kingdom of heaven. Let us meet these days of preparation for the great feast of the Koimisis with thoughtfulness and pray, "Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, Savior, save us.!"






A NOTE OF HEARTFELT THANKS







Vacation Church Camp

Glory be to God! Our 5th Annual Vacation Church Camp 2017 was, once again, a great success!

This year we had 29 campers, 22 helpers and several fantastic teachers! We were fortunate to have extra help prior to camp beginning with craft prep work and decorating the hall and classrooms so that everything was transformed into the feeling we were all traveling on the "Ark of Salvation". We learned about the four feasts of the Theotokos: Her Nativity, The Entrance into the Temple, the Annunciation, and her Dormition. Camp took place on



June 12-16 from 9:30am - 12:30pm. As an added treat we had awesome Holy Apostles T-shirts that the directors decorated for each and every participant and helper!

The children started off with a worship service and lesson with Father George. Following this, they had a lesson, craft time, and music. Recess was held outside with a different game each day. Afterward, they all gathered in the sanctuary for the Missions Moment.



This year we decided to focus our Missions Moment on several countries in which the IOCC (International Orthodox Christian Charities) helps families in need. We asked campers to bring in various health and hygiene kit items. These items included such things as toothbrushes, soaps, bandaids, hand towels etc. We had a goal of creating 10 kits to send to these various countries in need. We were delighted to witness the excitement our youth had to help others. We surpassed our goal and collected 52 complete kits. The campers also donated candle money to help out the church every morning as well. We are so very proud of our Holy Apostles youth!

We ended the day with a snack and trivia "game show" to review what we learned about our Orthodox faith, facts about the Theotokos, and the feast days of the week. On Friday, all the activities, lessons and music culminated into a wonderful program. The children recited a Bible Verse, they also sang songs and liturgical hymns. Father

blessed all the icons of the Sweet-kissing icons that all campers made and decorated during the week. The campers brought home many fun crafts (Ark Spinners, windsocks, a hand-made medallion of the Theotokos). 



Our Chapter, founded by members of our wonderful Holy Apostles parish, had a very active Spring and at the same time, helped the community in so many ways. Here's a glimpse:

On May 21, we joined over 1,000 Chapters and over 60,000 AHEPANS across North America to celebrate AHEPA Sunday. As one of the fastest growing Chapters in the United States, we were honored to recognize key people within our great parish community for their spectacular accomplishments by awarding over \$5,000 and so much more. Scholarships were awarded to deserving High School Seniors, awards to qualifying High School Juniors, and medals to exceptional Greek School students. And, with AHEPA Chapters having helped build, remodel, & enhance churches for decades by raising millions, we were blessed to have been able to make a contribution to the HOLY APOSTLES BUILDING FUND, dedicating the memorial service to deceased AHEPANS, & hosting the coffee hour.




