"Shine, shine, O New Jerusalem! For the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. Rejoice and be glad, O Zion, and you, O Pure Theotokos, exalt in the Resurrection of Him who you bore"

My Beloved in the Lord,

Χριστός Ανέστη! Christ is Risen! Today, we have received new life as we receive the light of life. Today, all of creation rejoices as it is resplendently renewed by its Creator. Today, the darkness that came over Adam when he was exiled from Paradise is overcome by the Light of the New Adam. The darkness which had plagued a bewildered humanity is pierced with the Light of Christ which indeed dispels all darkness. Our journey from the darkness of our exile to the Light of our Lord once again opens the door of Paradise to us. This journey, which started more than forty days ago on Clean Monday, found us sojourning the dark depths of our souls as we sought to prepare ourselves for this very moment of transformation in which our inner darkness would turn into the radiant light of Christ's Resurrection. It was necessary to traverse this darkness since our fallen state necessitates us to actively seek the True Light in our pursuit of coming closer to our Lord, God, and Savior, Jesus Christ. This traversing brings us to the precipice of today's feast which is the feast of feasts - Holy Pascha. The Holy Passion of our Lord and the physical Resurrection of Christ liberated our bodies and our souls from the curse of death. Through His Passion the human race is able to receive a transformed body at the end of times and through His Resurrection, humanity is enabled to have a bodily resurrection as well where the body and the soul are once again united in God's everlasting Kingdom. EPISTLE READING: Acts of the Apostles 1:1-8



In the first book, O Theophilos, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commandment through the Holy Spirit to the

apostles whom he had chosen. To them he presented himself alive after his passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days, and speaking of the kingdom of God. And while staying with them he charged them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me, for John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit." So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom of Israel?" He said to them, "it is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has fixed by his own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth."




HAGOC Vacation Church Camp June 18th-22nd; 9:30am-12:30pm



It is the True Light that we receive from Christ and it now becomes our responsibility to guard it and to share it with the world. Let us share this Light by proclaiming the Risen Christ to all we encounter. Let us share this Light by praising God at all times and in every hour. Let us share this Light by living a life not unto ourselves, but unto Christ. Let us share this Light by caring for the poor. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father. (John bore witness to him, and cried, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, for he was before me."') And from his fullness have we all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.
