My Beloved Parishioners,

On Sunday, June 12, Orthodox Christians throughout the world will observe the feast day of Pentecost. Special prayers are read on this day during the service of Vespers, which is celebrated immediately following the Divine Liturgy. During the

commemoration of this great day in Christian history, we are reminded of the promise made by our Lord to the Disciples: "These things I have spoken to you while being present with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you" (John 14:25 & 26).

The Holy Spirit is sent as "The Comforter," the "Spirit of Truth," who will guide the Apostles and the Church in maintaining the correctness of the Faith, as taught by our Lord and developed in the theology of Holy Scripture and the sacred Councils. Nowhere is confidence in this assertion better expressed and experienced than at the first Council of the Apostles in Jerusalem, as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles (15:6-29). The Apostles and elders of the Church were in disagreement on certain issues and came together to discuss what should be done regarding them. In a letter sent from Jerusalem to the Church in Antioch, the Apostles establish clearly what needs to be done regarding the matters discussed by them at the Council. What is of ultimate importance is the manner in which they formulate and express their decision. They write: "For it seemed good to the Holy Spirit, and to us..." (v. 28). Clearly, they were conscious of the presence and guidance of the Holy Spirit in their work. Their decisions, therefore, became normative for the life and practice of the Faith. They are obeyed and observed, because they are not "man-made" rules, but a way of life, "for the edifying of the body of Christ" (Eph. 4:12). Everything done by and in the Church has as its goal this

unique purpose: to make us "a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light" (I Pet. 2:9).

The history of our holy Orthodox Faith is a living witness and testimony to the struggles of the Apostles and Fathers of the Church to maintain the integrity of Christ's teaching, as reflected in His life and thought. The saints of our Church, those brave men and women of all ages, willing to shed their blood and sacrifice their lives for Christ and the truth, continue to inspire us today as we strive to maintain the Faith. All Orthodox Christians, from the day of our Baptism and Chrismation, are endowed by the Church with a personal experience of Pentecost, enabling us to witness to our Faith in Christ Jesus through words and works and, in so doing, become, each to his own ability, "the salt of the earth" and "a light of the world" (Mt. 5:13&14).

Let us continue, beloved in Christ, by exercising our spiritual responsibilities as members of the Body of Christ and invoking the grace of the Spirit in our life and work, to manifest the joy, hope and peace of our Faith to all the world that, in the end, all may be saved.



Christos Anesti! We had a wonderful Lenten Season and especially Holy Week at the Greek Orthodox Parish of Loudoun County. One of the many benefits of having our own, full-time priest was realized as Fr. George put together a full schedule of Lenten Services including Lenten Lectures. Our blessings are many, and your Parish Council is very hard at work defining the next steps for our young Parish...more on those plans later in this article.

There is no rest for the weary however. Right now, the Festival Committee and Parish Council are finalizing over 100 days worth of work, research, and decisions concerning the planning of our 3rd Annual Greek Festival, set for the 20-22 May! We are actively seeking donations to help offset our start up costs and as always are badly in need for volunteers to start signing up for shift work during the festival itself. We would not be able to run our Taste of Greece or Greek Festival events without the help of our volunteers. There are so many benefits to our church when these events are successful...from community outreach to raising money for our building fund, etc. You are the face of our Parish, and are a big reason for all of our successes. I look forward to seeing you all out there this year.

Now that our leased facility is 98% complete and we have Fr George on board full-time to guide our spiritual growth, it is time to start the next phase of our plan...Building our Church. There is a great deal involved with this phase obviously...but the bottom line is, we need to aggressively start to raise money to secure land for our Church. With that being said, there are two Parish Committees that are under-manned right now that will be getting the Parish Council's full attention almost immediately. First, there is the Future Planning Committee. Right now that committee has two people on it and we need more help. The second committee is our Fundraising Committee. We need creative thinkers on both committees to help with our planning, and to help with raising money to meet our goals. Creative fundraising through our surrounding community is a necessity to get this project (Build our Church!) off the ground. We have grand ideas of building a beautiful Byzantine-style church that can seat 500 people here in Loudoun County...but those ideas require hard work and people dedicated to the cause. The 11 members of your Parish Council cannot handle this task on their own...we need your help. If you are interested in helping us with this next important phase of our growth or have any questions, please contact me via email or phone and I'd be happy to talk to you about these opportunities. Until then, pray for good weather during the weekend of our Greek Festival and we'll see you all on the dance floor...OPA!

Coffee Hour Change

As many of you may know, Cynthia and Jeff Smith have coordinated and implemented our Fellowship hour since about the time we formed our parish almost 5 years ago. During that time, Parish Council members also assisted with our weekly coffee hour duties. The parish is grateful to Cynthia and Jeff for all their time and effort and for making our Fellowship hour such a wonderful event following Divine Liturgy. As much as they, and the Parish Council, have enjoyed doing this for our church, the time has come to handle our Fellowship hour in a different way.

Several options were discussed including asking our parish members to volunteer to serve on a Fellowship Committee, only offering a few items, or rotating the coffee hour schedule amoung the various parish organizations. It seems like the best solution is to do a coffee hour rotation among our various organizations. How it will work is that each of our ministries or groups will be assigned coffee hour for an entire month. It will be up to the groups themselves to coordinate the bringing in the of food on their designated Sundays and do the set up and clean up. The Parish Council will still start the coffee in the morning but the bulk of the weekly hosting will fall to our parish groups. Under this new arrangement, each ministry will host 2 times a year. Cynthia will still oversee the Fellowship hour in that the

groups can let her know if we are low on supplies and if special arrangements need to be made for Memorials, etc.

The new schedule will start in June with the Parish Council being the group to host Fellowship hour as well as doing the set up and clean up. Other ministries will follow. Stewardship

We have received 84 pledges totaling \$98,495 for an average of **\$1,165 per steward**. This average represents a **17% increase** over 2010 and 53% of our 2011 Budget. But we still have a long way to go to meet our goal of at least 180 pledges and \$180,000. So if you have not done so already, please submit your pledge card today!
