A Message from Father George Alexson



Beloved Parishioners and friends,

I write this message on the third day of our New Year. Let us all pray that this year, 2019, will be the beginning of a new journey for our parish. Holy Apostles was formally endorsed by His Eminence, Metropolitan Evangelos, on September 22, 2006. We now stand on the threshold of our thirteenth year, a significant number: our Lord and His twelve Apostles. At no other time in the history of our parish have we faced such an urgent decision, that demands our careful study and attention. By now, you have received several messages regarding the purchase of land for a permanent home for our community. Allow me to draw on some familiar idioms to make my point. First, we can no longer “kick the can down the road.” To push this decision farther along will prove both irresponsible and inconsiderate. I sincerely doubt that we shall ever have another incredible opportunity, such as that which presents itself. Second, all the members of our parish, who love and cherish what we have accomplished to date, must take the “high road,” and do what is both noble and right for the future of our community. Finally, we have arrived at that point where “the rubber meets the road.” The challenge facing us is both immediate and necessary. There is no time left for quarreling about the past. If we truly believe, as I do, that our Lord Himself is guiding us, and by His grace has brought us this far, why can we not set aside past grievances, and stand

together to make our dream an authentic reality. As our Lord warns us, “Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation, and every city or house divided against itself will not stand” (Matt. 12:25).

I have been told by several of our founders, that His Eminence warned when we first entered our present facility, “not to get too comfortable in it.” Unfortunately, his wise advice went unheeded and, I fear, for too long too many of our members have been satisfied with our convenient “store-front church,” as His Eminence has been wont to call it. To remain where we are, and at the same time expect to grow and flourish, marks the height of a grave blindness that refuses to anticipate the future. Or, rather, failure to purchase this property will be denying ourselves the future that we and our children deserve.

I began my service to this wonderful parish on Sunday, January 2, 2011. From the very beginning, I have worked with our Parish Councils and parishioners for this very purpose: a church and community center that will make our Orthodox presence a dynamic reality in Loudoun County.

“If God is for us, who can be against us?” (Rom. 8:31). God will be for us if we act for Him, for His glory, for His will and purpose. I summon all of you, parishioners and friends alike, to work together for the completion of this goal. I implore you, let us not fail the Lord our ourselves. Rather, let us, “Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths” (Proverbs 3:5-6).

May His peace, love and grace sustain and guide us always! Amen!

Message from the Parish Council President

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I hope everyone had a beautiful and blessed Christmas!

Holy Apostles' ministries undertook a variety of activities to celebrate this most holy day. Here's just a sampling of these activities:

- The Sunday School and the Greek School put on an entertaining, yet spiritual Christmas program.
- PAREA gave the parish's Yia Yias and Papous Christmas gifts that included homemade cards by Hope & Joy's children.
- Philoptochos lovingly prepared tiropita and spanakopita platters for holiday tables, and made icons, jewelry, and other meaningful items available for purchase as Christmas gifts.
- AHEPA coordinated a Toys for Tots drive and hosted a Christmas luncheon.

I know I speak for everyone in the parish when I express my sincerest appreciation for all our many ministries do, especially at such special times like Christmas. Remember that it's never too late to join a ministry, and in fact the beginning of a new year is a terrific time to join as ministries kick off new programs and initiatives.

As we look ahead in the calendar, we're thrilled for Holy Apostles' "Taste of Greece", February 15, 16, and 17. TOG features delicious Greek food, dancing from our parish's Greek dance troupe, exciting raffles, and so much more! TOG is fun and a terrific showcase for Holy Apostles and the Orthodox faith, and it's also a very important fundraiser: more event information -- including how you can volunteer, buy/sell ads, and/or purchase raffle tickets -- is coming soon and I hope everyone can find a way to participate!

We also look forward to taking the next step in our journey toward establishing a permanent home for Holy Apostles in Loudoun County. Shortly before Christmas, we formally went under contract for the purchase of the 7.5 acres of land off Claiborne Parkway that we discussed across 2018. This contract represents a major milestone in our church and I'd like to thank everyone who made it happen.

With the execution of the contract, our 90-day study period began. During this time, we will carefully examine the property to ensure that it is right for our parish. This includes geotechnical studies of the land, as well as meetings with the county, banks, and architects. It also includes the development of initial renderings of our future church. Throughout this study period, we will send out weekly email updates and speak after liturgy most Sundays.

We will present the results of the 90-day study at a special general assembly (GA) on March 10. During that GA, we will vote as a parish on whether to proceed with the purchase.

While we've come a long way -- doubling our Building Fund to over

\$1.3M in about 6 months -- we still need to raise an additional \$900,000 to buy the land outright. This will enable us to keep all 7.5 acres intact and build our permanent home on our timeline, breaking ground as soon as this year.
