A Message from Father George Alexson

"And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." (Rom. 12:2)



The conclusion of the year 2012 was not a particularly happy one. The nation was stunned and saddened by the massacre of the innocents and teachers in a school in Connecticut. We all grieved, prayed and continue to mourn this senseless loss, while our politicians and the country are engaged in a fierce debate on gun control. When and how it will end is anyone's guess.

It was also an election year. The President won re-election. As for Congress, there were winners and losers. We pray that God will bless and guide them all, with wisdom and courage to do the right thing for our country and world.

On the ballot in many states appeared several controversial issues, from same-sex marriage to gambling. Unfortunately, the divisive issue of same-sex marriage won the day in several states, so that now the sacred bond of marriage has been completely redefined and no longer adheres to the Biblical definition given by God Himself. This tragic decision is further complicated by the

dis-unity among our Christian churches regarding the meaning and purpose of marriage. No greater example of this exists at present, than the announcement made by representatives of the so-called "National Cathedral" in Washington to wit, same sex marriages will now be blessed there in "religious ceremonies."

This decision made by the Episcopal clergy (I hesitate to refer to them any longer as a church) is in direct conflict with the moral and spiritual life of the Christian Faith. It betrays everything the Holy Gospels teach regarding fidelity to the Word of God and the summons to, "be transformed...to the good and acceptable and perfect will of God." I grieve that the leadership of the Episcopal creed has seen fit to separate from the Christian faith and tradition; now they are completely conformed and assimilated with everything that is sinful, unacceptable and imperfect according to the mind of the fallen world.

There was a time when the Orthodox Church maintained a hopeful and healthy dialogue with Episcopal clergy and theologians. Now, all we can do is summon them to repent and return to the authentic faith of the Church established by our Lord and His Apostles. Any attempt to continue a dialogue as though we were equals in a common bond of Christian belief would be a travesty. Throughout the years the Episcopalians have made too many unilateral decisions regarding faith and morals that we can never accept. To pretend that they do not matter flies in the face of everything we Orthodox cherish and live as the uninterrupted treasure of our spiritual life and existence. We must maintain the Truth as we have received it. We must steadfastly refuse to conform to this fallen world. We must heed the warning of the great Father of our Church, St. Maximus the Confessor, who writes, "A mind distant from God becomes either demonic or bestial." Let us pray that our Lord will give us all, clergy and laity, the courage and strength to stand fast and witness, without hesitation, to the Faith and Gospel that transforms and saves all who seek the truth in Christ. Let us remain, for the sake of the world, Orthodox, in everything this word conveys, lest we deprive ourselves and the world of the one place where the demonic and bestial can be met face to face and. through the power of Christ, healed and saved. His Church, my beloved, exists precisely for this reason: that we may forever know and be reminded that, "to be conformed to" the world and "to be transformed" in Christ are mutually exclusive endeavors. Pray we will be led by the Holy Spirit to continue on the right path. The grace of our Lord be with us all!

Welcome to HOPE/JOY!

HOPE (Holy Orthodox Primary Education, grades K-2) and JOY (Junior Orthodox Youth, grades 3-6) are ministries of the Orthodox Church. HOPE/JOY are not organizations or clubs, but are a gathering of the faithful of the Church who share the same grades, ages, and common interests. The mission of HOPE/JOY is to strengthen the relationship of young Orthodox Christians with our Lord through worship, fellowship, service and witness.

The program works to educate and edify young members of the Church, encouraging them to become active sacramental participants in the life of the Body of Christ. These ministries offer our young Orthodox Christians the opportunity to experience the Faith, ultimately leading them to salvation. HOPE/JOY are but no means to this end; they must not stand alone, but rather be incorporated into the life of the Church and its mission. We generally meet once a month, and in addition to meetings we have activities, such as visiting a youth shelter, and going ice-skating.

Hope/Joy has been a busy group! Last September, our first activity was a walk for the homeless. We also visited the Loudoun Youth Shelter at Christmas time. We brought gifts for the children, sang Christmas carols and gave them cookies. This is an annual event for our children. We had over 20 children and families participate. Hope/Joy also had its'

monthly meetings, and we made seasonal crafts. Our own dear Father George attends our meetings, and we are fortunate to have him with us.

Our next meeting is Friday, February 8, 2013 at 5:30 pm at the church. We will have a potluck dinner, with each family bringing a child-friendly dish to share. We will also have drinks and dessert, also potluck style.

Hope/Joy meets every month on the 2nd Friday, at 5:30 pm, at the church, unless we notify you otherwise. Here are our meeting dates for the Spring semester:



Sunday School

God's Fine Balance



In the Creation story of Genesis we read that God made both "male" and "female" and He saw that it was good. One can understand the role of man as being attributive to that of the Father and the Son. However, where is the feminine model? Some Fathers of the Church, and later theological commentators, have suggested feminine and maternal characteristics to the role of the Holy Spirit within the Trinity. As God has given us a male model to follow through His Son, a feminine model has been given through the Theotokos.

In many cultures the female is viewed as a lesser human being, and here, in our "modern society", in order to compensate we have gone overboard and elevated her as equal to man. The question is not one of equality; who is smarter, stronger, and ultimately better, but rather what are our each individual roles? As we distinguish mighty Saints of God, we recognize that many of them are women. In fact it's been documented that many male Saints had a women guiding and inspiring them. After all, has not a woman been responsible for every great Saint that has walked this earth? Let us not destroy His creation; God has taken everything into consideration.

As we look at today's society we see gender roles changing quickly; most noticeably with the acceptance of "same sex marriages". The Sacrament of marriage is one in which the two genders created by God become one. How dare we overstep the bounds set by our heavenly Father, by His Word (Jesus), and through the power of the Life-Giving Spirit, to reflect anything different? As our children grow and go into the world to become great leaders of our society, let us pray that the Faith they carry will endure and prevail. God has created a fine balance, let's not mess it up!

Many thanks to the 3rd-4th grade catechetical school teacher, my wife Carol, for sharing her thoughts, especially, with regards to the prayer of the Holy Spirit, and being there to help inspire me.







Where are you from?

I grew up in rural New Jersey in Hunterdon County. I attended American University in Washington DC, which is how I ended up in the DC area. My husband and I have lived in Ashburn since 1996.
