A Message from Father George Alexson



Beloved Parishioners and Friends.

Abba John the Short said: "It is not possible to build a house from the top down; one must build it from the foundation to the top." "What does this saying mean?" his disciples asked him. The Elder replied: "The foundation is your neighbor, whom you must win over to Christ by your love-and this must be done first; for on him depend all the commandments of Christ" (The Evergetinos).

We in the Orthodox Christian world are fortunate to have as part of our spiritual inheritance the wisdom of the desert fathers and mothers. Their spiritual struggles enlightened not only their lives, but provide for all of us examples on our path to salvation. We need only to take the time to read their works, and apply their lessons to our own life.

The scriptural passage upon which Abba John establishes his teaching is found in Mark 12: 30- 31: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' No other commandment is greater than these." Holy Scripture preserves many commandments given us by God, but our Lord identifies love of His Father and our neighbor as the most important of all. The holy Apostles understood this well. They spared no sacrifices in their witness to the Gospel in order to build up the Body of Christ, His Church. Following the Ascension of our Lord, they went out into a hostile world, to fearlessly teach and preach the majestic principles of a Gospel heretofore unheard of for its emphasis on love, self-sacrifice, humility, obedience, patience, and all the other virtues expected of humanity created in the "image and likeness of God." In his First Epistle to the Corinthians St. Paul describes the life, dangers and risks he and his fellow Apostles suffered in order to preach the Word: "We are fools for Christ, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are honored, but we are dishonored. To this very hour we are hungry and thirsty, we are poorly clothed, we are brutally treated, we are homeless. We work hard with our own hands. When we are vilified, we bless; when we are persecuted, we endure it;..." (4:11). All of this the beloved Disciples endured so that they could, "equip the saints [meaning all baptized Christians] for works of ministry, to build up the body of Christ" (Ephesians 4:12).

It has been so great to see our church's youth gather for another rewarding year of Sunday School. I want to congratulate Denise Lansdell on a successful kickoff and thank her for her work over the summer getting the teachers and classrooms ready. If you missed the registration, it is never too late to sign up. Please see Denise or any Parish Council member at church and we will make sure your child gets registered.

Now is also a great time for your child to join one of our faith-based youth groups. Each meets monthly throughout the school year and provides our children an opportunity to learn more about the faith through fun activities and fellowship with their fellow young Christians. The Future Planning Committee continues to be busy developing our permanent home in Loudoun County. I am pleased to announce that we signed a letter of intent to sell up to two acres of land adjacent to the Toll Brothers building to Rooney Properties. This non-binding agreement sets the framework for negotiations of a purchase contract. After receiving two letters of intent from interested parties, the PC felt the Rooney offer was best for our community as it was for less acreage, at a higher price per acre, and provides for shared

parking. Once the purchase contract is finalized, it will be presented to the General Assembly and our Metropolitan for approval.

Please keep an eye out for an announcement regarding our Fall GA date, likely in late October or early November. In addition to presenting the terms of the sale contract, we will also be soliciting nominations for next year's Parish Council members, auditors, and election officials (ballot counters). Please consider volunteering for one of these rewarding roles within our church!

Thank you to everyone who came out to our Property Tour and Gyro Cookout after church on Sunday, September 22nd. Despite the heat, we had over 50 parishioners attend! Everyone enjoyed touring our land and talking to Parish Council and Future Planning Committee members, all while enjoying a delicious gyro. A special thank you to Mediterranean Breeze Restaurant for helping cook the gyro and for their donation of pita bread. Also thank you to our servers Con Sofologis and Nick Spyros.

We signed a letter of intent (LOI), an intention to purchase that is non-binding, with Rooney Properties. Rooney Properties wants to build a parking lot on up to 2 acres adjacent to the Toll Brothers building for approximately \$500,000 an acre and will share the parking lot with us.

This LOI sets the framework for negotiations of a purchase contract of which we have begun. Once the purchase contract is finalized, it will be presented for approval to the parish at a General Assembly, and also to Metropolitan Evangelos.




