Dear Parishioners,

Xristos Anesti! Christ is Risen! We hope you all had a wonderful Easter.

In just six weeks, Friday June 12 – Sunday June 14, our parish will host its “1st Annual Greek Fair and Food Fest”. The event will be the first of its kind in Loudoun County and the first event of such magnitude by our young parish. It

is critical that we have a successful event, both for the purpose of generating a recurring revenue stream that will allow us to grow and reach our long-term goals, as well as to generate a positive reputation for our community! To this end, the Parish Council has approved a budget of \$25,000 toward the funding of this event. To our young parish, this is a lot of money; however, we believe it will prove to be a good investment in the future of our parish.

To make this event successful, we need the help and support of everyone. We are asking for volunteers and donors of various items to help offset the cost of the event. The event will surely be a success if we all pitch in. Please consider how you can participate in this effort.

Vendors – we will have 10 vendor spots available at a price of \$300 for the entire weekend.

Greek Band/Singer - \$300/hr; you may donate any quarter of an hour for \$75 (Goal: 10 hrs.)

Gyros – donate \$75/cone (Goal: 75 cones)

Souvlakia – donate \$100 for 50 lbs. of chicken (Goal: 800 lbs.)

Greek Fries – donate \$20/case (Goal: 40 cases)

Sodas – donate \$10/case (Goal: 200 cases)

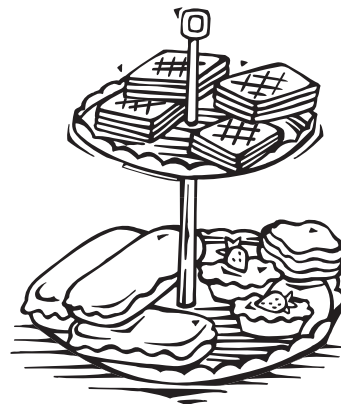

HOPE&JOY

CHRISTOS ANESTI! CHRIST HAS RISEN!

HOPE&JOY had quite an eventful, spiritual lent. We attended two Lenten retreats. Our first one was the weekend of March 7th & 8th at the HOLY Protection Monastery in White Haven, Pa. at the beginning of lent. Nine children from HOPE/JOY and GOYA attended along with 18 other parishioners. It was a great way to begin Great Lent, focusing on redirecting our minds and souls towards coming closer to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ and trying to reach Theosis. We attended Vespers Saturday evening and Divine Liturgy Sunday morning. We were able to tour the monastery, shop at the bookstore/gift shop, and hear some of the most beautiful awe inspiring chanting we've ever heard by the nuns. We felt like we were in heaven! The priest who serves that monastery, Father Mark, spoke with our children about keeping their spiritual focus on Christ and His teachings. He answered many interesting questions that our children asked and kept them engaged in discussion for well over an hour. The kids, as well as the adults, had a great time and we all left feeling spiritually equipped and ready to take on the challenging road ahead of us for Great Lent.

The end of March, we had a HOPE/JOY meeting which focused on learning about The Last Supper, Christ's betrayal by Judas, His denial by Peter, and His Passion leading up to His crucifixion, death, and Holy resurrection. After reading the Bible stories about these events, the kids participated in a "Resurrection egg" hunt. Once they found their eggs, they opened them up to find a surprise inside each one which correlated to a Bible verse relating to one of the events we had just learned about. They each did a wonderful job in being able to match their item from the eggs with the correct Bible verse. At the end of this meeting they were all able to practice Greek dancing with Ms. Maria Plevrakis and some of our GOYA children.

Our second retreat was towards the end of lent on Friday, April 10 hosted by St. George's Greek Orthodox Church in Bethesda. They were so kind as to invite our HOPE&JOY children to their Lenten retreat. Eight of our children were able to attend and, if you ask them, "IT WAS AWESOME!!" They had several stations which were run by their GOYA and Sunday school teachers. In each station they learned about every day of Holy Week through fun, interactive activities. They also learned about and participated in the Holy sacrament of confession. The day culminated in a challenging "Bible Jeopardy" game for the older participants and palm folding into crosses for the younger group. St George's HOPE&JOY provided a continental breakfast and a delicious Lenten lunch. All together there were about 80 children there. Thank God and St. George's wonderful parishioners for thinking of us!

After the Divine Liturgy for Saturday of Lazarus, HOPE/JOY sponsored a Lenten brunch for all those attending the Palm folding into crosses for Palm Sunday. We a great turnout of HOPE/JOY & GOYA children as well as several other parishioners, and were able to make over 400 Crosses!

Our HOPE/JOY & GOYA children that danced at our "Taste of Greece" in February were requested to dance at the Doukenie Winery's "Taste of Greece" on May 16th!! Congratulations to our dancers for performing so well that they received a request to perform at this event. Let's all come out to support our children and the Doukenie Winery on May 16th!
