A Message from Father George Alexson

"Turn not Your face from Your child, for I am afflicted; hear me speedily. Give heed to my soul and redeem it" (Psalm 68:17)

My beloved brothers and sisters,

On Monday, March 14th we began our Great Lenten journey; yet another opportunity given us by God for spiritual renewal. The prokeimenon for Vespers on Sunday evening leading us into Lent, is taken from Psalm 68, quoted above. In this verse, the psalmist pleads with God not to turn His face away from him. When I think about these words, I am compelled to ask, why would God do such a thing? Would God do to us what we so readily do to one another? How often we turn away from each other in anger or discord, because we are unwilling to treat each other charitably, and with humility offer forgiveness for wrongs committed. As I contemplate the verse on a deeper level, I come quickly to a sorrowful conclusion: it is not God who turns away, but I. No, the psalmist didn't get it wrong. He does well in his request, for he now realizes that upon returning to the Father, he is compelled to beg His forgiveness for the pride and rebellion that stole him away from His loving embrace. The merciful Father is called upon by His disobedient child to show, once again, the true meaning of love that saves, transfigures and repairs our broken humanity.

We are invited by the Church during Lent to engage in an earnest struggle for the integrity and well-being of our soul and body. We accomplish our ascetic endeavors by means of fasting, prayer, charity, and, most importantly, examination of our life, our failings, the weight of our sins and transgressions. It is for this purpose that our Lord instituted through His church the Holy Sacrament of Repentance or Confession. Unfortunately, too often we ignore the need for this sacrament, either from ignorance, pride or shame. But, as the Fathers of the Church warn us,

"Do not say: "I have sinned much, and therefore I am not bold enough to fall down before God." Do not despair. Simply do not increase your sins in despair and, with the help of the All-merciful One, you will not be put to shame. For He said, "he who comes to Me I will not cast out." (John. 6:37) And so, be bold and believe that He is pure and cleanses those who draw near to Him. If you want to accomplish true repentance, show it with your deeds. If you have fallen into pride, show humility; if into drunkenness, show sobriety; if into defilement, show purity of life. For it | Highlights: is said, "Turn away from evil and do good" (I Pet. 3:11) (St. Gennadius of Constantinople, The Golden Chain, 87-89). And again, "Every sin that is left without repentance is a sin unto death, for which if even a saint shall pray, he shall not be heard" (St. Mark the Ascetic, Homilies, 2.41).

The need for repentance and confession is a daily experience in the life of the Christian sincerely struggling for perfection. The following counsel assures us of that: 'A young monk said to the great ascetic Abba Sisoes: "Abba, what should I do? I fell." The elder answered: "Get up!" The monk said: "I got up and I fell again!" The elder replied: "Get up again!" But the young monk asked: "For how long should I get up when I fall?" "Until your death," answered Abba Sisoes' (Sayings of the Desert Fathers).

How should we prepare ourselves for confession? A guide for this can be found at our parish or on the internet. Following is a useful list of instructions as to how we should approach the sacrament of forgiveness and healing, and how and what it is we ought to confess:

- First, we do not blame others for our sins, refer to them by name, or confess the sins of others. We accept responsibility for our sins and avoid making excuses.
- Second, we avoid lengthy accounts and descriptions. We should be concise and to the point.
- Third, we do not confess in generalities and with vagueness (for example, "I am a great sinner;" "I am guilty of every sin," etc.). We refer to those sins we have committed and that have separated us from the love of God.
- Fourth, there is no need to make reference to our good deeds or our (non-existing) virtues.
- Fifth, there is no need to refer to sins we have confessed in the past, unless we have repeated them.
- Finally, we do not hide anything, lest we make a mockery of the Holy Sacrament

(from the book: "Repentance and Confession," the Holy Metropolis of Argolidos).

For the confession of sin is the cause of true humility" (St. Isaac the Syrian, Homilies, 71).

Let us, my beloved friends, not lose this opportunity for repentance and transfiguration, as we make our way to the goal of our Lenten struggle: the victory of our Lord and Savior over sin and death. May our Lord bless us with courage, conviction and strength to endure the labors of the spiritual arena. May His peace and love be with us all always!

Stewardship Sunday Parishioner Testimonial, Kathy Kastrenopoulos Sparkman

Good morning everyone!

My name is Kathy Kastrenopoulos Sparkman, and I am a member of this parish. My parents, sister, and I immigrated to the US from Greece in November 1976. We settled in Annandale where I spent all of childhood, and a few early adult years. We attended Saint Katherine's throughout those years and after relocating to Loudoun County in 1996.

In 2006, my husband, son, and my parents became part of this church when a fellow parishioner, Myrianthi Anthony informed us of a church establishment in Loudoun County. We were super excited and joyfully attended services, seated on wheeled office chairs, in a conference room, held out of the Holiday Inn Conference Center in Sterling. God has certainly blessed us as we have come a long way; but our efforts and journey do not end here.

I am thankful for the families and individuals that pioneered the journey by embracing the idea and dedicating themselves to make it happen. It is a blessing to be part of our parish community. Our church is more than just a building and icons on the walls. Our church is life; she lives and breathes through the support and volunteer efforts of our parishioners. The Lord invites us to act, to the best of our ability, to prosper His house through the continued commitment set forth by our founding families to keep our church alive.

The Lord calls upon us to give freely from the heart, knowing our abilities and circumstances better than we know them. God knows where, when, and how we can fulfill our duty as His faithful servant. He blesses us with gifts; it should be with a joyful heart we return these gifts by donating our time, talents, and financial contributions towards the life and prosperity of our church. We shall give as we receive.

Our Ministries offer several opportunities to serve our church and everyone can help. My son and I both have been involved in many ways. Both of us served with the Greek Festival, Taste of Greece, Stewardship, and Easter preparations. Additionally, last summer I had the privilege to serve as one of the teachers for our VCC Summer Camp program...which was a rewarding experience to say the least, and we had so much fun! This year I joined the Easter Flowers Committee. Dimitri has served as a Sunday School aide, coaches GOYA Basketball, and now serves in the Alter. The Parish Council, Philoptochos, Stewardship, Catecheti-

cal/Greek & Sunday School, GOYA, Hope & Joy, PAREA, and AHEPA exist because of individuals such as you and I am willing to serve at any capacity. And just as we serve these Ministries, they in turn serve us and the community in so many ways. As our Ministries receive so shall they give; and I experienced this firsthand.

Most of you know that I had a challenge with a cancer that nearly killed me on three separate occasions. Diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma on February 17, 2012, I went through a challenging 32 months. I spent 22 months in aggressive treatment involving several chemotherapy regimens, radiation, alternative medicine, hospitalization, and two stem cell/bone marrow transplants. Then I faced an additional 10 months of health complications due to the extensive treatment.

During this time, I was mostly incapacitated and weak due to treatment, weight loss, and malnutrition from being sick. Although at times I was barely hanging on in body, God upheld me in mind and spirit, surrounded by the unconditional love, prayers, and support from my church family through thought, word, and deed. Dimitri became the communication link between our parish and me; updates, prayers, countless meals, and extended offerings. None of that would have happened if our church did not exist. The community response was humbling and left me in awe. And although nothing I say can express or capture my gratitude for the love and support that came out of this church, know that I was praying and continue to pray for each of you. As you prayed for me, I prayed for you. As I receive so shall I give.

The church lives and breathes through the support and volunteer efforts of our parishioners. Without this support, we have no church. Without our church, we have no community. It is vital we continue our journey supporting and expanding our church, not just for today but also for future generations.

I will leave you with a quote I read the other day: "What we do for ourselves dies with us. What we do for others and the world remains and is immortal." Let us keep this in mind as we fulfill our commitments and continue our journey in 2016.


This poem is dedicated to all the Greeks who left our beloved Greece and built their lives in America. Written in 1992 by Marina Blair



Community Outreach—Chili for Charity

First, an enormous THANK YOU to all of our parish - those who offered their time to feed some of Loudoun's neediest residents, and to those who gave generously towards our efforts. The Lucketts Community Center, where we held our event, is located on route 15 (entrance and address is Lucketts Road) almost directly across from 2 trailer park communities. There is a temporary housing motel a little further south on 15 as well. The population is largely Hispanic and there are many, many children. Each of the 3 mentioned locations have 10-25 children that get on the bus at those stops every morning. Our family moved to a neighborhood in Lucketts in August and our daughter attends Lucketts Elementary. Volunteering there twice a week, I see first-hand the struggles of some of those children. They are decent, loving people. It is an incredible blessing to be able to give in the name of Christ to these families.

The kitchen at the Community Center had never hosted an event like this before. They rent out the kitchen to private parties but the advisory board met and decided to give it to our church rent-free Saturday March 12th because of our mission. The director, Hilary Cooley, is an amazing lady who helped put all the pieces of this event together. She holds a VA Health Department issued food preparation license and volunteered her time to be present during our entire event, so we were covered legally through her. She literally gave up her entire Saturday so we could do God's work.

In giving a background summary to all of you, I would be remiss if I didn't extend a special thank you to Tim & Diane Boone. They graciously offered to pay for our entire Chili for Charity event. This is amazing! While they did not do it for any recognition, only because of their generosity, the other funds that were donated to the church will be able to go towards the "Back Pack Program" at Lucketts Elementary - an initiative to stock needy children's back packs with non-perishable foods so that they can eat substantially over the weekend. We will be issuing a check to the school in the very near future. God bless them!

Although fliers were disseminated 2 weeks prior to the event in English and Spanish throughout the community, we found very few local residents actually seeking chili. A very special parishioner, Juan Gisone, who is a native Spanish speaker, walked to both trailer parks and spread the word about our event in Spanish. His natural disarming personality helped coax many reluctant folks across the street, where warm chili awaited them.

While we did not serve the 150 folks that we hoped to reach in Lucketts, all the leftover chili was delivered to a Leesburg homeless shelter, run by the charitable nonprofit "Volunteers of America". None was wasted, and the homeless residents were very happy to receive our chili. Marina Blair, our Parish Council President was even able to make connections at the shelter and has been promised opportunities for our parish to provide and serve warm meals in the future to the needy there. What an incredible blessing!

We are also looking to see if there are any adults who are interested in learning how to Greek dance. Please contact me if you are interested.






