A Message from Father George Alexson



"Do You Know Where...?"

Back in the 1960s, 70s, and 80s, a popular public service announcement would appear on television, usually around ten or eleven o'clock at night, asking parents: "Do you know where your children are?" The purpose of the announcement was to encourage parents to maintain a keen interest in the whereabouts of their children, especially in regards to the company they were keeping.

Alas, the need for vigilance over our children never ends. Of course, technology has made it a lot easier to keep track of their physical location. But do parents really know where their children "are" ideologically? Are parents keeping a close enough watch on the intellectual, moral and social maturity of their children, as well they ought to be. I put this question to our parents: "Do you know what your children are learning?" Do you discuss with them the content of their lessons and, what their teachers are teaching? If not, then the following incident from a school in Tennessee is the eye-opener you need, to encourage you to do just that.

High school students from an Honors World Studies class in Tennessee were taken on a field trip to a mosque and a Hindu temple. According to one newspaper report, while at the mosque they were treated to punch, cookies, and readings from the Koran. Upon leaving, they were given copies of the Koran to take with them.

One student refused to go on the trip, much to the chagrin of her teachers. Thus, in place of the trip, she was made to write a paper comparing and contrasting the Christian, Hindu and Islamic faiths. To assist her, her teachers gave her materials: one page on the sayings of Jesus, two-thirds of a page on the sayings of Ghandi, and five pages on Muhammed. I note, with no remorse for sarcasm, that the section on Islam was titled, "Religious tolerance in Islam."

To the student's credit, she wrote on her paper, in spite of her parent's warning that she risked being failed, "Because of a surplus in information on Muhammed, and a lack of complete and thorough information on Mahatma Ghandi and Jesus Christ, there is not enough true facts to properly complete a comparison and contrasting paper." Needless to say, she was given a zero by these "educators."

Fortunately, her vigilant and courageous parents confronted the school board and her teachers regarding their intolerable provocation. When they asked why the trip did not include visits to a Christian church and a synagogue, they were told that the school could not afford excursions to so many places. To add insult to injury, they were accused by the teachers of being hostile to Islam. The final and most egregious insult came when a teacher told the parents: "I can't believe you would question our motives with your children."

My advice to all parents: Question! Question! Question!

I have no problem with students learning about other faiths and cultures. I was born and reared in a city where the diversity of races, nationalities, colors and creeds made life truly fascinating, while encouraging us to be open and tolerant towards the "other." Tolerance and openness, however, are meaningless sentiments if they inherently demand contradicting and denying the integrity and veracity of one's own religious, moral and historical identity. Nor should tolerance and openness require or consent to an expectation of historical revisionism in order to make the "other" more appealing than the reality, past and present, would allow.

What happened in Tennessee was a deliberate and unacceptable attempt to force a student to draw comparisons between religious faiths based on inadequate and, in this case, biased materials. Her parents were right:





either study all religions represented in our society or none at all. Or better, leave the spiritual, religious and moral formation of our children where it belongs: with their parents and religious associations. In any case, parents should never relinquish their right and responsibility to monitor, question, and, if need be, challenge the content of their children's instruction, especially when public schools deviate into the realm of faith and morals. Remember these two important facts: school boards and educators are not without their own peculiar agendas. Nor, are they more infallible in their selection of materials and projects than the parents who entrust their children's education to them. Public schools exist for the purpose of educating our children in those subjects necessary to their future employment as useful and successful citizens. Journeys into moral and religious instruction are better left to those adequate to the task.





Greek School

Dear Parents,

I hope you all had an enjoyable summer with your families and I wish your children a very successful school year in all their studies. As you are aware, the church operates a Greek Language Afternoon School Program, starting at age 4. Adult classes are also offered. Classes are held one of two days, Wednesday or Thursday from 5:00 – 6:45 p.m., starting October 9th for Wednesday classes and October 10th for Thursday classes.

Our school provides a safe and stimulating learning environment where each participant is valued, nurtured and encouraged to grow individually. As part of a growing community, our school continues to offer a unique experience to all students who attend and promote their intellectual and social abilities.

We offer a structured and fun learning approach, by providing a teaching environment in the Greek Language, culture and faith where each student develops their own talents. The teachers are chosen for their love of teaching the Greek Language, for their strong background and experience, for their moral standards and their desire to work and instruct the students and helping them succeed.

It is important to maintain a secure foundation for future growth. It is a priority that your child's success no matter how small it may seem will be acknowledged. The more your child is exposed to the Greek Language, the easier it will be for him/her to incorporate new skills.

One of our main goals is to help families of Greek and Non-Greek heritage backgrounds raise bilingual children; which in this day and age is a challenge. We all share the passion for our Greek Language and are committed to teach and help each of our students reach their growth potential. Emphasis is on teaching our children the Hellenic Language, reading, writing and Hellenic culture, history and values with a Greek Orthodox background.

All of our students will be offered a challenging, high quality and beneficial Greek/English developmental curriculum which is appropriate for their age group and level such as the Papaloizos textbooks and workbooks. These books are developed for the teaching of Greek as a Second Language. In addition to the Papaloizos books, our students will receive supplemental books and or handouts.

During class, our students will be encouraged to express themselves in Greek, and are always encouraged to participate in conversations to communicate both teacher to child as well as child to child. This will enhance their comprehension, self esteem, and will develop positive self concept and skills by communication to one another. The activities are selected carefully to appeal to different learning styles and level appropriate. The students will be given the opportunity to "learn" and to recognize the Greek alphabet and their sounds, then creating syllables which conclude to words, phrases and even sentences. They will be involved in listening and learning songs and stories, learning the colors, counting, identifying flashcards, playing educational games, conversations, grammar, reading/writing skills and a lot more. Upon conclusion of each semester, each student will be evaluated through testing as recommended by the Archdiocese. First, one hears, then one understands, then one speaks!

I believe that a good parent-teacher relationship is necessary for maximum school success. By all of us working together, we can make this a very successful school year. This will enable each of us to establish procedures that enhance learning and contribute to a safe, orderly and positive environment. We will help every student achieve their full potential and ensure success throughout the school year. I will gladly answer any questions, and welcome your suggestions and valuable feedback.

I am looking forward to welcoming back our old students and meeting new ones and their families. Please take the time to read and/or complete the following. All of this information can be found on our website: Registration Form, Policy/Procedures and Calendar.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO JOIN? Any male at least 18 years old, in good standing in the community, fills and submits an application and membership fee, and takes an oath to abide by the rules and ideals of the Order of AHEPA.

WHEN WILL THE NEW CHAPTER BE ESTABLISHED? The plan is for the new Chapter to be established and fully functional with elected officers and approved bylaws by the end of 2013.

WHY JOIN AHEPA? About 40 parishioners of the Loudoun Greek Orthodox Parish already are members of AHEPA Chapters. Many of these members have already expressed the wish to join our new Chapter to focus our work and resources to the parish missions and for the good of our community. AHEPA has contributed more than \$15,000 to the Loudoun Parish's building fund and general operating fund. They also have provided financial support and awards to the Greek School. Two parish students have attended the AHEPA Academy. Several parish students have won AHEPA scholarships. The nearest other Chapter is about 30 miles away.

DO YOU HAVE TO BE GREEK AMERICAN TO JOIN? No. Anyone can join. Two local congressmen are members of the Falls Church Chapter. Presidents Truman and Ford were members of AHEPA.

WHAT WILL IT COST ME? There is an annual membership fee. The exact amount for the new chapter will be determined by the organizing committee, but will not be higher than \$100 per year.

READY TO JOIN? Fill and submit the Application for Membership. Sign the petition for new Chapter.



It is what we do and how we act in this life that determines our position in God's Kingdom. As Christ taught us, we ought to store up our treasures in heavenly places. 
