#### A Message from Father George Alexson

"Lord, I have heard Your report and was afraid; I considered Your works and was greatly astonished"

"I behold a new and wondrous mystery! My ears resound to the shepherd's song, piping no soft melody, but loudly chanting a heavenly hymn! The angels sing! The archangels blend their voices in harmony! The cherubim resound their joyful praise! The Seraphim exalt His glory! All join to praise this holy feast. He who is above now, for our salvation, dwells here below; and we, who were lowly, are exalted by divine mercy! Today Bethlehem resembles heaven, hearing from the stars the singing of angelic voices and, in place of the sun, witnessing the rising of the Sun of Justice! Ask not how this is accomplished, for where God wills, the order of nature is overturned. For He willed He had the powers He descended. He saved. All things move in obedience to God. Infants, that they may adore Him who became a little child, so that out of the mouths of infants He might perfect praise; Children, to the Child who raised up martyrs through the rage of Herod; Men, to Him who became man that He might heal the miseries of His servants; Shepherds, to the Good Shepherd who has laid down His life for His sheep; Priests, to Him who has become a High Priest according to the order of Melchizedek; Servants, to Him who took upon Himself the form of a servant, that He might bless our stewardship with the reward of freedom (Philippians 2:7); Fishermen, to the Fisher of humanity; Publicans, to Him who from among them named a chosen evangelist; Sinful women, to Him who exposed His feet to the tears of the repentant woman; And that I may embrace them all together, all sinners have come, that they may look upon the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world! I hold in my arms the cradle of Christ! For this is all my hope! This is my life! This is my salvation! And bearing it I come, and having from its power received the gift of speech, I too, with the angels and shepherds, sing:

"Glory to God in the Highest, and on earth peace to men of good will!"

I'd like to first thank the Stewardship Committee for all the work they have done this year planning the many events we have had: Adult Wine Night, Family Bowling, Mother-Daughter Tea, Parish Picnic, Quattro Goomba's Winery family night, plus 2 Stewardship Sundays.

The Committee members are Kristina Ayoub, Bill Bakopanos, Mina Baldinger, Marina Blair, Julie Burke, Christy Lisciandro, and Nick Spyros. Thank you for giving our church your time and talents this year.

Stewardship or membership to our church is made up of 3 parts.

TIME: The one thing we all have is time, okay maybe not a lot of it, but we all have it. And we decide where to spend it. Giving of your time is part of your membership to this church, it has to be a priority or it will never fit in your busy schedule. I recently had a Steward who has a young child call me, and she said that it would be hard for her to volunteer at church because of her little one, but if there was anything she could do from home she was willing. So she helped with the Parish Christmas Card mailing, stuffing envelopes, right from home. That's exactly the spirit we are talking about. If you don't make "time" for the church, then you are telling God that HE is not a priority in your life.

TALENT: God has given each of us talents. What better place to use them then at our church! Can you sew? I'm sure there are Christmas pageant costumes that can use some TLC. How about helping decorate the boards in our church hall? You can sing? Join the choir! Again, you have the choice where to apply your talents in your life. Whatever your specific talent is, there is a group here that can use it. See me after church and let's match your talent to the right need in our parish.

TREASURE: Every year we ask you to fill out a pledge card. This is the amount of Stewardship you are committing to pay toward our annual budget. The good news is this year, all of you who turned in a card, pledged a total of \$178,000. That is a record high, and we thank you for committing your treasures to the church to help pay our bills. The problem is right now, of that \$178,000 pledged, we have \$15,872 outstanding. Imagine having a budget for the year, as the church does, you are just 7 weeks away from year-end, and you are over \$15,000 short. Many of you are on weekly or monthly payment plans, and I thank you for continuing to stay current with your pledge. I know we can count on you to continue that to complete your pledge by year-end. Our church has basically been surviving on your regular payments.

For those of you who are not paying your full pledge, this is a big problem for our church. We cannot continue the practice of waiting until December 31 to get your stewardship and get us out of the red at the last minute. The church is here for you every day of the week, not just on Sundays, holidays, funerals, weddings and baptisms. But it can't continue to be here for you every day if your membership is not being paid.

Stewardship should be paid in a lump sum at the beginning of the year, or if you can't afford to do that, then in weekly or monthly payments so the church has the income it needs throughout the year. Please see me so we can work out your payment and we can get that \$15,872 that the church is counting on down to zero.

In conclusion, let me ask you a few questions, and please repeat with "I

- Who is going to give of their time to our church? (parishioners respond: "I will")
- Who is going to make our church their priority and not just a Sunday event? (parishioners respond: "I will")
- Who is going to examine their own talents and offer them to our church? (parishioners respond: "I will")
- Who is going to pay their full membership pledge to this church by December 1? (parishioners respond: "I will")

Yes, YOU will because if God was standing in front of you right now and asked you to support HIS church, you wouldn't say no. You would say, "I will."

## **Stewardship Sunday Parishioner Testimonial** Ron and Mina Baldinger

Our family found GOPLC in 2007 when we moved to South Riding, Va. We are a military family and have grown accustomed to moving every 2-3 years, each time having to find a church to fit our family's needs. Of course, if a Greek Orthodox church was available, that would be our first stop, however, many times this was not an option. Often we would attend a non-denominational service on base, ensuring we were in attendance on the occasion an orthodox priest would visit. We were so fortunate to find this church and community in 2007 and immensely enjoyed our time becoming part of the GOPLC family. After only 1 year, however, the Air Force decided it was time for us to move on. In 2008, we moved to Germany, then to Spokane, Washington. During those 4 years away, we made a decision to continue to be members of the church because we wanted to see it thrive, we wanted to maintain our sense of belonging to the church and we loved the church and hoped to return to it one day. We maintained our stewardship through the entire time away because it was so important to us.

Twenty-five years of moving around proved to be a challenge to us as an Orthodox family. We were excited when we heard in 2012, after 4 years away, that we would be moving back to the area but this time we would be all the way in Maryland. We actually tried several other churches in the area but never felt welcomed like we did here at the GOPLC. There is just something very unique about the friendliness of the people, even though there were several new faces here, everyone was still very welcoming and many people remembered us. We quickly realized the commute was well worth being part of the church family we had found 3 moves earlier and had stayed connected to.

We have tried to be involved as we can be. There are so many thriving ministries in the church and people are always so welcoming and friendly so it is easy to feel a part of the church. Ron is a member of the AHEPA, I have started being more active in the Philoptocos, last time we lived here my daughter was a part of the Greek School, my kids attend the Sunday School, we have worked the Greek festivals and we are slowly getting more and more involved. I recently was asked to join the Stewardship Committee and felt honored that I was asked to

I think our family is very typical of the modern Orthodox family. I was born and raised into a Greek Orthodox family. My church was immigrant based and my father came from Greece after WW II. My mom is not Greek and converted to Orthodoxy. When Ron and I got married, Ron converted to Orthodoxy but it was a decision he had to make for himself, not for me. We chose to raise our kids in the Orthodox faith, and while my kids do not understand the Greek language they can appreciate the traditions of the church and of our culture. I think our church is a wonderful mixture of old Greek, new Greek and converts. That is the face of the modern Greek church.

After moving around for 25 years, it can be really tough to be the new person. It can be challenging to make friends, to break into established groups and to be accepted. And unfortunately, Greek churches can often be the hardest to break into. But not the GOPLC. I don't know what it is but this church exudes warmth, perhaps it is the leadership because we have some extremely friendly, welcoming members who work to bring you into the fold. After 25 years, it can be tiring to be the new person. That is why it was a no brainer to come back to this church. We now live in the Lorton/Alexandria area, this is about a 45 minute drive for us. It would be more convenient to go to St. Katherine's but we don't. We make the drive because I know that when I get here, I will be greeted by every single person that I see when I come through the door, that people will ask about my family/kids and that people know who I am. That means A LOT to me.

I strongly encourage you to get involved. Share your talents and your strengths with the church. I have seen this church grow in our absence and it is amazing how many people and programs we have. It is amazing when I see so many people show up to our annual gala, our Greek festivals, our church picnics, the Goya talent show, the laying of the wreaths at Arlington Cemetery and so many other events. There is a lot of passion for our church and its survival.

We know that so many of you feel just as we do and know how incredibly blessed we are to be part of this family. That is why we've never stopped giving since first coming to this church, whether we were down the street or across the globe. Thank you so much for this opportunity to speak and share our story. We thank every one of you for all you do and hope you will continue to give so we can continue to grow our church.




Special thanks to everyone who came out to help us bake baklava, spanakopitas and tiropitas. It was a successful bake sale.



#### Prosfora = Bread for Holy Communion

We need 5 Prosfora every week 4 Prosfora for a Sunday Liturgy & 1 for a Weekday Liturgy Total: About 240 Prosfora per Year

Beloved Parishioners,

What a blessing it is for someone to make a Prosforo or to bring some Wine for Holy Communion! We need about 240 Prosfora every year. If all of us participate by offering 20 Prosfora for a month, we would be called on only every five years to meet this obligation. You can find the recipe on our Church's Web page.

Could your family (if unable to personally make the Prosfora) offer a small donation towards this endeavor? The cost is \$8 per Prosforo (\$ 160 for one full month). Money collected for this effort (we want to make this very clear) will be used to purchase bread only from the Monastery of Agia Skepi = Holy Protection of the Theotokos located in White Haven, PA (your donation is tax deductible).

The Sisters bake exceptionally good Prosfora and, because it is bread used for the Holy Liturgy, it cannot be shipped. Thus, we depend on parishioners who visit the Monastery  $\mathfrak b$  bring the Prosfora to us and if anyone plans to visit Agia Skepi, please let us know. We will provide you the funds to bring Prosfora for our beloved parish.

Prosfora can be offered for special occasions: Anniversary, Birthday, Memorial service, Nameday or, for loved ones struggling with illness. When you offer Prosfora, you should submit the names of both the living and deceased to be commemorated by the Fr. George.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to all the ladies/families or groups for supporting this sacred effort by baking or purchasing Prosfora.

The following ladies or groups offered 20 Prosfora each for one full month: AHEPA, GOYA with thei advisor Sofia Kouiroukidis (They made their own Prosfora), Hope & Joy with their advisor Ava Walte (These young children made an effort to make 20 Prosfora for our Church. Also, many ladies bring once a while a Prosforo or more in honor or in memory of their family members too.
